## ALAMEDA COUNTY HEALTH UPDATE

Updated COVID-19 Testing Guidance for Alameda County - 5/12/20

The following updated guidance for COVID-19 laboratory testing is intended to inform Alameda County Public Health Department (ACPHD) efforts to control the epidemic and aid decision-making by clinicians and other testing providers. The guidance sets out groups that should be prioritized for testing but it is not a requirement to test in these groups. Testing decisions and policies must be flexible to account for ongoing limitations in testing resources and protective equipment. Clinical judgment should be used to guide testing of symptomatic persons. ACPHD typically issues additional testing guidance for certain settings and situations, including outbreaks.

## **Actions Requested of Clinicians**

Clinicians are encouraged to test<sup>1</sup> for COVID-19 in:

- Hospitalized patients
- Healthcare workers seeing patients, first responders, and other essential service workers
- Persons with <u>COVID-19 symptoms</u> who are ≥65 years of age OR have chronic medical conditions<sup>2</sup> that increase the risk for severe disease
- Persons identified for testing by ACPHD case, contact and cluster or outbreak investigations
- Persons with <u>COVID-19 symptoms</u> residing in congregate settings<sup>3</sup>
- Asymptomatic persons residing or working in congregate settings in certain situations:
  - If results can be used to inform outbreak response, infection control efforts, resident placement, staff and resident cohorting, and continuity of care when residents are transferred or discharged
  - Screening before or at admission may be considered if information can be used for cohorting

Persons under 65 not meeting the above criteria who are otherwise healthy and experiencing mild symptoms should be tested as resources permit and according to clinical judgment. Alameda County is working to expand access to COVID-19 testing in communities disproportionately impacted by the epidemic.

Routine clinical testing of asymptomatic persons not in a priority group and without suspected exposure to COVID-19 is not recommended, although such testing may be done for research or surveillance purposes.

All testing providers should have plans to disclose test results, link persons to appropriate care, and report cases to the Alameda County Public Health Department or the health jurisdiction of residence. According to state regulation,<sup>4</sup> race and ethnicity information must be included when reporting cases.

Results from serologic tests for COVID-19 should be interpreted with caution in the clinical setting. In general, they should not be used for acute diagnosis of COVID-19 disease or to infer immunity to SARS-CoV-2. Molecular testing should be used to make a diagnosis when acute cases of COVID-19 are suspected. Serologic testing for diagnosis of acute COVID-19 infection is not currently recommended.
