Interim Quarantine Guidance for Vaccinated Health Care Personnel

February 22, 2021

CDC has recently released <u>additional quarantine guidance</u> for persons fully vaccinated against COVID-19. Vaccinated persons with an exposure to someone with suspected or confirmed COVID-19 are not required to quarantine if they meet <u>all</u> of the following criteria:

- Are fully vaccinated (i.e., ≥2 weeks following receipt of the second dose in a 2-dose series, or ≥2 weeks following receipt of one dose of a single-dose vaccine)
- Are within 3 months following receipt of the last dose in the series
- Have remained without <u>symptoms</u> since the current COVID-19 exposure.

The Alameda County Public Health Department (ACPHD) has updated <u>Health Officer Order 20-06</u> (Blanket Isolation/Quarantine Order) to align with CDC recommendations.

The purpose of this interim guidance is to clarify options available to fully vaccinated Health Care Personnel (HCP) who have had <u>close contact</u> or a <u>high-risk exposure</u> with someone with a suspected or confirmed COVID-19 infection. This guidance is subject to change as more information on vaccinated individuals becomes available.

- 1. Fully vaccinated HCP with a high-risk exposure within a healthcare setting, or close contact with a known case in the community, do not need to quarantine, but may be excluded from work.
- If asymptomatic fully vaccinated HCP have a <u>high-risk exposure</u>, including an exposure outside of the health care setting, **AND** the facility <u>is not experiencing a staffing shortage</u>, facilities should consider excluding the HCP from work for 10 days after the exposure (defined as Day 0), with continued symptom monitoring through Day 14.
 - a. Consider excluding HCP who have routine close contact with people at high risk of severe disease (e.g., severely immune-suppressed patients), or who live or work in congregate settings (e.g., long term care), for <u>14 days after exposure</u>.
- 3. If the facility <u>is experiencing a staffing shortage</u>, the facility should prioritize shortening or forgoing work exclusions for asymptomatic fully vaccinated HCP over unvaccinated HCP—unvaccinated HCP should be the last to return to work before the <u>ACPHD criteria to end quarantine</u> have been met.  Guidance for unvaccinated HCP has not changed—in most cases unvaccinated HCP should quarantine for 10-14 days following a <u>high-risk exposure</u> within the healthcare setting, or <u>close contact</u> with a known case in the community.
