HOW MUCH IRON DO CHILDREN NEED EACH DAY?

Children 1-3 years old need 7 mg of iron per day Children 4-8 years old need 10 mg of iron per day





Potato with Skin 1 small = 1.5 mg of iron

Whole Grain & Enriched Bread 1 slice = 1 mg of iron
