Probate conservators identify, marshal, liquidate and manage all assets of each estate, setting up trust accounts from which payments for care and comfort are made. In Probate conservatorship of the person, the Public Guardian-Conservator is

responsible for ensuring proper food, clothing, shelter, and health care.


