








ALCO VOAD Organizations

Vision

Bay Area Demographics

- There are 10,276,231 people in 16 counties
- 675,000 children live here
- 2.5 million individuals with disabilities/access and functional needs
- 5 million pets
- Roughly 216,000 tourists visit the region daily
- Daily commuting population is approximately 550,000
- 17 Native American Tribes in three counties
