### Alameda County Children's Health and Child Care Initiative (Care for Our Kids)



- County-Wide Half-Percent Sales Tax Measure
- Estimated \$150 million/year new funding for Children's Hospital Trauma Centers & Child Care & Early Education

- Community Driven (Parent Voices, Resource & Referral Agencies, Labor, CHO, Providers and ECE stakeholders) with community accountability
- Election: March 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2020



#### Funds dedicated to –

- Improve access through Centralized Eligibility List and scholarship/enrollments to reduce waiting lists and increase access to care
- Rate enhancements (including supporting a wage floor at \$15 per hr.)
- Quality (including Quality Counts supports, professional development, inclusion, facilities renovation and expansion, mental health consultation, data integration, & evaluation)
- Support and improvement of the Level 1 Pediatric Trauma Center and subspecialty recruitment & retention

ECE Governance - Seats Appointed by AC ECE Planning Council & Board



- Seats appointed by Board of Supervisors
  - 2 members child care workforce-1 center, 1 family child care, at least 1 of whom is a member of a union

- 2 Parents/guardians at least 1 of whom must have experience in a subsidized program or subsidy wait list
- 1 Alternative Payment agency (5 in Alameda County)
- Seats appointed by Planning Council:
  - 1 Alternative Payment agency
  - 2 Admin./Directors center participating in the county's subsidized program; at least 1 public agency
  - 3 Discretionary seats may include AC Office of Education, higher education, parents, public agencies, labor, etc.

### ECE Plan Focus





- Keep children and families at the center
- Continued priority for new enrollments and rate enhancements to support access, improve quality and increase ECE workforce wages
- Emphasis on 0-5 and highest need

## What Has Changed Since Measure A?



Adjustments to budget projections due to:

- Changes in State subsidy programs
  - Infant rate increase
  - Expansion of contracted full-day programs
  - 12 month eligibility in CalWORKs
- Increased state commitment to
  - Workforce stipends and professional development
  - Inclusion
  - Facilities
  - Mental Health Consultation
