Changes happening now with BART Paper Tickets



Sales of BART paper tickets have already stopped from the machines at 19th Street Oakland, Embarcadero, Powell Street, and Downtown Berkeley BART Stations.

- 1. BART is <u>moving away</u> from paper tickets to the Clipper Cards
- 2. You will still be able to use paper tickets at all BART Stations
- 3. Red and Green BART paper tickets will still be available to purchase by mail and at BART Customer Services Office at the Lake Merritt BART Station
- 4. BART plans to stop selling Blue Paper
 Tickets in BART Stations at the end of 2020


Example of a Regional Transit Card (RTC) Discount Card



Why get a RTC card?

- If you are disabled and under sixty-five years (65) old
- If you have an attendant that travels <u>with</u> you
- If you travel, some transit agencies outside the Bay Area will accept the RTC photo ID to provide discounts

Parts of the RTC card



Senior Clipper Card



- Must be 65 Years Old or Older to Qualify for Senior Clipper card
- 62.5% Discount Same as BART Red Tickets
- There is no application fee to get a Senior Clipper card
- If you are 65 years old or older and you have a RTC ID discount card, switch to Senior Clipper card
 - No photo ID on the senior Clipper cards
- Senior Clipper cards does not expire


BART tickets

Can NOT be transferred to your...

RTC ID Discount Cards (or any Clipper Cards)

BART Blue High Value Ticket

A 6.25% discount in two denominations: a \$48 ticket for \$45; a \$64 ticket for \$60



BART Green* Ticket

A 62.5% discount for seniors 65 years and older: \$24 ticket for only \$9



BART Orange Ticket

A discount for middle and secondary school students. Special purchasing restrictions apply.





BART Plus Ticket


A "flash pass" for other transit operators.

BART Red* Ticket

A 62.5% discount for persons with disabilities, Medicare cardholders and children 5-12 years old: \$24 ticket for \$9




BART tickets can only be used or refunded for cash








