SRI International in Menlo Park is creating a mental health assessment for youth with Intellectual Disability (ID). We are recruiting youths and their caregivers for a 1-3 hour interview, where they will be asked questions about the youth's mental health. Participants will play an important role in an effort to improve the mental health outcomes of adolescents and young adults with ID. Who can participate?

- Youth with an intellectual disability aged 14-24.
- Parents or caregivers of these youth.

What will participants be asked to do?

- Each participant would take part in one individual session of approximately 1-3 hours (with breaks) at the SRI International office in Menlo Park (travel cost reimbursed) or offered at your preferred location.
- Youths and their caregivers will be asked to respond to a set of interview questions about mental health.

How do youth and caregivers benefit?

- **Participating youth and their parents or caregivers will each receive reimbursement for their time in the form of a \$50.00 gift card.**
- Participants will contribute to an important effort to develop the first diagnostic assessment of mental health disorders among youth with ID.

Participation in this study is voluntary. All participants' information will be kept confidential. Participation has no bearing on participants' status in any program or referring organization.
