



RCEB Services and Supports to Help with Going to College

Services are assessed and determined on an individualized basis. All generic resources must be explored before RCEB is able to consider funding. Speak to your Case Manager about your specific goals and needs and for more information

Adult Day Program: For adults who have completed public school services to increase their skill levels, prepare for a maximum level of independence in their community, and to prepare for employment.

Case Management Services: Advocacy, client program planning, coordination of generic services, consultation, information, and referrals.

Educational Advocacy: Referrals, support, and/or attendance at Individual Education Program (IEP) meetings and other school meetings.

Independent Living Services: Training in areas necessary for persons to live independently without supervision and support services.

Social Skills Classes: Mostly for those diagnosed with Autism who have intense social skill development needs and may require structured experiences in order to promote positive relationships and participation in age-appropriate activities.

Supported Employment: For those interested in job development, job placement, and ongoing supports/services to obtain and maintain employment.

Supported Living Services: Services and support for persons to live in homes that they own, lease, or rent. Range of services and supports may include: assistance in finding a home, social, behavioral and daily living skills training and support, and hiring and training individuals to provide personal care.

Tailored Day Program: An alternative to traditional day program services. Provides highly customized training to individuals in areas of employment, volunteer placement, postsecondary education, and community integration.
