- Job shadowing and mentoring opportunities




POSTSECONDARY COUSELING

WORKPLACE READINESS TRAINING

- Learn how to search and apply for jobs
- Learn ways to begin working

WHO QUALIFIES FOR STUDENT SERVICES?

- Students with a disability
- Age 16 to 21
- Enrolled or enrolling in school
- Any school that provides a recognized credential of education

DOCUMENT REQUIREMENTS

- DR 203 DOR Student Services Request Form
- Supporting documentation for school enrollment & disability
- DR 203 signed by school staff
 - If it is not signed by school staff, provide IEP or 504 Plan
- DR 260 Consent to release and obtain information
- DOR 205 Student Service Agreement form



APPLICATION

Who completes the application?

- Students/parents/or school staff
- Complete the DR 203 STUDENT SERVICES
 REQUEST Form
 APPLY NOW
- Submit the form to the DOR
- DOR staff will follow up with the student directly to provide needed services

OVERVIEW

Student Services is great for you to get a job you want.

- Start thinking about your career
- Learn problem solving regarding barriers to employment



- Develop social skills and independent living skills
