Offer a variety of ways to connect with:

- Local businesses
- Get real-world work experience
- Get internships, apprenticeships, short-term employment/on-the-job training
- Informational interviews to research local employers
- Job shadowing and mentoring opportunities



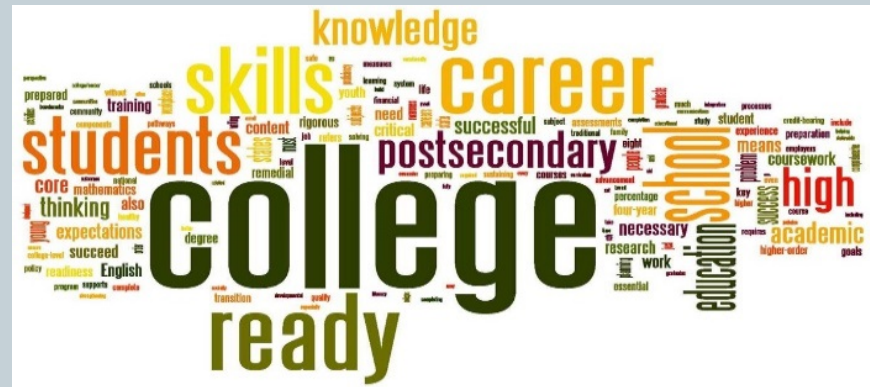
# POSTSECONDARY COUSELING

# WORKPLACE READINESS TRAINING



Helps prepare for employment:

- Good work habits
- Developing independent living skills
- Communication/interpersonal/“soft” skills
- Work Incentive Programs
- Understanding employer expectations
- Learn how to search and apply for jobs
- Learn ways to begin working



# SELF-ADVOCACY SUPPORT



- Helps you build leadership skills
- Gain confidence in professional environments
- Understand what you need to succeed in the workplace
- Learn about individual rights and responsibilities
- Learn how to request accommodations, services/support
- Learn to communicate thoughts, concerns, needs for various situations

# WHO QUALIFIES FOR STUDENT SERVICES?



- **Students with a disability**
- **Age 16 to 21**
- **Enrolled or enrolling in school**
- **Any school that provides a recognized credential of education**



# DOCUMENT REQUIREMENTS



- DR 203 DOR Student Services Request Form
- Supporting documentation for school enrollment & disability
- DR 203 signed by school staff
  - If it is not signed by school staff, provide IEP or 504 Plan
- DR 260 Consent to release and obtain information
- DOR 205 Student Service Agreement form



# APPLICATION



## Who completes the application?

- Students/parents/or school staff
- Complete the DR 203 STUDENT SERVICES REQUEST Form
- Submit the form to the DOR
- DOR staff will follow up with the student directly to provide needed services
