

# COMMUNICABLE DISEASE REPORTING

Title 17, California Code of Regulations, Sec. 2500, requires that known or suspected cases of any of the diseases listed below be reported to the local health jurisdiction within the specified time frame:

\* Severe infection (MRSA or MSSA) is defined as admission to the ICU or death. Previously healthy person is defined as "a person who has not been hospitalized or had surgery, dialysis, or residency in a long-term care facility in the past year, and did not have an indwelling catheter or percutaneous medical device prior to current illness".
