

Course Overview of I-100, I-200 and IS-700

IS-700

This course introduces and overviews the National Incident Management System (NIMS). NIMS provides a consistent nationwide template to enable all government, private-sector, and nongovernmental organizations to work together during domestic incidents.

Course Objectives:

1. Describe the intent of NIMS.
2. Describe the key concepts and principles underlying NIMS.
3. Describe the purpose of the NIMS Components including: Preparedness, Communications and Information Management, Resource Management, and Command and Management.
4. Describe the purpose of the National Integration Center.

Note: This course provides a basic introduction to NIMS. It is not designed to replace Incident Command System and position-specific training.

I-100

This course is an introduction to the Incident Command System (ICS). Topics include:

- Introduction to ICS, basic features of ICS, incident commander and command staff functions, general staff functions, facilities, and common responsibilities.
- The foundation to enable entry-level personnel to function appropriately in the performance of incident-related duties.

I-200

ICS 200 is designed to enable personnel to operate efficiently during an incident or event within the Incident Command System (ICS) in the roles of the Incident Management Team Command and General Staff positions. ICS-200 provides training on and resources for personnel who are likely to assume a supervisory position within the Incident Management Team General and Command Staff. The inter relationship of Command and General Staff is broadly addressed but not the roles, responsibilities and duties of each position.
