# The Trouble We're In

- \$20 billion deficit: \$6 billion current year, \$14 billion 10-11
- \$20 billion deficits, through 2013
- \$32 billion in cuts, February and July budgets
- \$8 billion + in taxes expire 2011: sales, income, vlf
- \$1.7-2 billion in new corporate loopholes take effect
- Loss of stimulus funds
- 75% of state budget is local support

# Governor's proposed "solutions"

- Federal funds: \$7.9 billion (!) additional
- Take away transit money, with complex switch
- Cuts in education, health, IHSS, social services
- Failure to get federal funds triggers more severe cuts: e.g. elimination of CalWorks, IHSS, Healthy Families, tax cut delays

- Many years of tax cuts back to 1994, \$6+ billion
- Borrowed for last deficit, \$3 billion debt service
- (Some interim good luck, tax shelters and amnesty)
- Great Recession: \$12 billion decline in revenue
- Phony solutions: selling compensation fund, accelerating revenues, illegal cuts
- 2/3 vote requirements (of course)

  - Only state, only place in world w/out oil production tax or royalties to state.
  - No impact on price of gasoline or oil production

- Loss carry-backs, credit-sharing, elective single sales factor
- Passed without hearings in budget hostage-taking

### • Broaden sales tax base: \$2 billion plus

- Electronic commerce, entertainment, golf, etc—many commodities, plus labor services. (Tax Commission recommendations)
- Reinstate top income tax brackets: \$4b, up to 6b
  - Top 1% has 25% of California income
  - No evidence of relocation effect from income tax
- Close corporate property tax loopholes: \$2b
  - Complex ownership forms make "change of ownership" difficult to track
  - Thousands of properties change ownership w/out reassessment

## 10 policies for \$20 billion (cont)

- VLF permanent at 1%: \$1.3b
  - Long-term stable solution to vehicle license fee
- End wasteful corporate giveaways: \$1b
  - Enterprise zones: definitive study, no benefit: \$500m
  - Like-kind exchanges for commercial property: \$350 m
  - Off-shore tax havens shelter billions: \$150 m
- Increase tobacco and alcohol: \$2.6b
  - Alcohol at 10 cents/drink: \$1.4 billion
  - Tobacco at \$1.50/pack: \$1.2 billion
  - (Marijuana: \$1.4 billion?)
- Improve tax collections: \$1.5b (initially)
  Withholding on independent contractors, "Amazon" nexus
- Keep <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cent of sales tax increase: \$2.5 billion
- Little evidence of economic harm, although burdensome

### Short-term Strategies/majority vote

- Tax collections: majority, opposed by Gov, \$1.5b
   Sales tax issue also benefits locals, businesses, jobs
- Fees: alcohol and tobacco, "charge for harm": \$1.8b
- Replace gas tax as fee, enact substitute revenue (Senate solution)= \$1 billion or more, rejected by Governor
- Change of ownership loopholes, potential majority, \$1-2 billion, not supported by Governor

## Longer term: structural change

- Reassess commercial property = \$8 billion for cities, counties, and schools
- Change vote requirements for taxes and budget
- Ease restrictions on local taxes
- Constitutional reforms/Convention Why?.....

- Special Districts: \$55 million
