What has changed due to COVID-19:

- ✓ All registered California voters will receive a vote-by-mail ballot beginning on October 5th
- ✓ Accessible Voting Locations will replace traditional neighborhood polling places
 ✓ Map of Accessible Voting Locations in Alameda County: acvote.org/avl
- ✓ There will be **additional 24-Hour Ballot Drop Box** locations where you can return your ballot ♥ Map of Ballot Drop Box locations in Alameda County: **acvote.org/dropbox**

What hasn't changed:

- ✓ You can still mail your ballot via the U.S. Postal Service, no postage necessary, **postmarked on or before November 3**rd. You can also take it to a ballot drop box or to the Registrar of Voters Office.
- ✓ In-person voting will still be available from:
 - October 5th to November 3rd at the <u>Registrar of Voters Office</u> in the René C. Davidson Courthouse basement, Room G-1, at 1225 Fallon Street, Oakland, CA 94612
 - Monday through Friday, 8:30 a.m. 5:00 p.m.
 - October 31st to November 3rd at Accessible Voting Locations
 - Saturday, October 31st 9:00 a.m. 5:00 p.m.
 - Sunday, November 1st 9:00 a.m. 5:00 p.m.
 - Monday, November 2nd 9:00 a.m. 5:00 p.m.
 - Tuesday, November 3rd 7:00 a.m. 8:00 p.m.
