Voting Is Recognized As A Public Health Priority

- In June 2023, Voter Participation was named as a 'core objective' in the nation's health goals, <u>Healthy People 2030</u>. US Department of Health and Human Services / Office of Disease Prevention and Health Promotion (ODPHP)
- The Office of Disease Prevention and Health Promotion (ODPHP)
 said: "Voting offers a chance for people to contribute to decisions
 that can affect their communities and directly or indirectly impact
 their health and well-being."
- The American Public Health Association (APHA) "Progress on health disparities will be limited if public health neglects to fully address the political determinants of health including civic and voter participation."
- American Medical Association (AMA) released statements supporting the importance of voting. "Gerrymandering which disenfranchises individuals [and] communities... negatively impacts health outcomes."

We All Have a Role to Play



Key Dates for Voters:

October 21, 2024:	 Last Day to register to vote. Register online at registertovote.ca.gov, at the registrar of voters, or with a mail-in paper voter registration form. To register to vote you only need the following: Your mailing address – to receive your mail in ballot. This can be a shelter or drop-in center, friend or relative. Your "residence address" this can be a shelter, street crossroad, or camp address. Your birthdate Either the last four digits of your social security number OR your California ID/Drivers License number
October 26-November 5 th :	Forgot to register? YOU CAN STILL VOTE! Go in person to an Alameda County Voting Center to register and vote at the same time!
October 26, 2024:	Opening of Alameda County Voting Centers for in-person voting or ballot drop-off. Voting Center Locations listed here .
November 5, 2025:	Election Day! You can mail in your ballot, drop off a ballot or register and vote at ballot at a Voting Center any time until 8pm Tuesday Nov. 5th.





Exercise Your Right to VOTE in 2024!

If you are experiencing homelessness, you can register and vote in the November Elections!

You are eligible to vote in Alameda County if you are:

- A U.S. citizen
- A resident of Alameda County
- 18 years or older on Election Day (November 5, 2024)
- Not <u>currently</u> in prison or on parole for a felony conviction

The last day to register to vote in the upcoming election is October 21, 2024. But if you don't register, you can STILL Vote before or on November 5th!



Voting Rights for People with a Criminal History

Persons with a criminal conviction have basic voting rights.

- If you have a misdemeanor conviction, you can ALWAYS vote.
- If you have a felony conviction, you CAN vote if:
 - You are on probation OR
 - You are on post-release community supervision OR
 - You are on mandatory supervision OR
 - You are serving a county jail sentence under Realignment OR
 - You have completed parole.

Put another way: The only time you CANNOT vote when you have a felony conviction is if:

- You are currently serving a state or federal prison sentence OR
- You are currently on parole.

All you need to complete your voter registration is:

- A mailing address where you can receive your ballot
- Any residence address (even if it's an outside location)
- Either the last 4 digits of your social security number or California ID/CDL number

DID YOU KNOW?

- ALL registered voters in California will receive a Mail-In Ballot sent to them before election day (November 5, 2024)
- You can either mail-in your ballot OR drop it off at an official ballot drop-box or at a Voting Center
- You can also register and vote in-person at one of Alameda County's Accessible Voting Centers starting October 26 until November 5th at 8pm.
- Pro Tip: Where's my ballot? Sign up to make sure your ballot was received and counted here.




You'll need to enter:

- Full Name
- Email address, phone (not required)
- D.O.B.
- State you were Born
- California Drivers License # or California ID #
- Last 4 #'s of Social Security Number
- Home address (can be a non-street address)
- Mailing address (where they'll mail your ballot)
- You don't need to select a political party preference.

How to Vote

Register to vote before October 21st!

Vote By Mail: Registered to Vote:

- Receive ballot (mailed off in early October)
- Complete Mail Ballot
- Place in Mailbox to send
- Place ballot in Official 24-Hour Ballot Drop Boxes (MAP)
- Postmark before or on Election Day Nov 5.

- Receive ballot (mailed off in early October) and voter guide.
- Fill out ballot, seal, bring to <u>Drop</u>
 <u>Box</u> or drop off at <u>vote center</u>
- Visit a Vote Center:
 - 11-Day Vote Centers (open Oct 26 – Nov 5th
 - 4-Day Vote Centers (open Nov 2 – Nov 5th)
- Nearest Vote Center map

4-day and 11-day Vote centers are open every day **9am-5pm** except on Election Day when they're **open 7am-8pm**.

Not Registered to Vote but Eligible:

YOU CAN VOTE PROVISIONALLY

- Believe you're registered but unsure where?
- Didn't receive/lost your vote-by-mail ballot?
- Haven't registered yet?

CAST YOUR VOTE!

- 1. Go to an <u>11-day or 4-day Vote Center</u> in person, during open hours
- Provide your Name, DOB, last 4 digits of EITHER: CDL/Calif ID or Social Security Number
- 3. Provide mailing address & residence address
- 4. Complete and submit ballot
- 5. They'll check your vote and if legit, it will be counted.






Alameda County Vote Centers Map

2 – Nov 5












What is Voting Matters?






